We are so proud of our students for completing another year of studying here with us at Todmorden High School. This week we had our Sports Day - and what a successful day it was - well done to all who participated and to all our staff who made such a wonderful day possible.

Our Learning Managers have presented their final awards this week and I was particularly impressed to hear about the number of Gold Badge Awards for exceptional behaviour handed out. Students need to acquire 1200 ARCH points to be awarded one. 142 Year 7, 104 Year 8 students, 123 Year 9 students and 95 Year 10 students (This is the most for a year 10 Cohort) and 24 students for Year 11. Every single award is to be celebrated for respecting and being guided by our ARCH values. Very well done to you, we are very proud of you - you should be immensely proud of yourself.

Five of our Y11 students visited Pembroke College at The University of Oxford. They had a really early start, meeting at Rochdale Sixth Form at 6am. The day provided an opportunity for students to visit one of the oldest and most prestigious universities in the world. The day was full and challenging with opportunities to meet current undergraduate students, lectures on law and politics as well as what learning at The University of Oxford entails.

One of the key aims of the visit was to dispel some of the myths around the exclusivity of Oxford and Cambridge. Guidance

KEY: \otimes on a plate (paper plates are available on the day)

All entries must have an entry ticket attached. If not, they won't be judged. Entry tickets are available at the produce tent on the day and can be collected in advance from Mays Shop.

Entry Fee: There is a charge of 50p per entry for all ages.

Adult & Teen Competition. Adults and teens can enter the same range of categories, but they are judged separately. If you are 17 or older please circle "Adult" on the entry ticket. If you are aged 12 to 16 please circle "Teen" on the entry ticket.

Children's Competition. A child's age should be written on all their entry tickets. Judges will see the child's age on the entry ticket and will judge accordingly. There are no separate age group categories.

Judging will be for first in any category plus a variable number of highly commended. Items not in accordance with the specified category will not be judged.

Blackshaw Optimistic Gardeners (BOGS) Trophy. This Trophy is specially for the Children's competition for the winner of the "I Grew A...." category.

Overall Winners. The winner of each competition is decided on points. 5 points will be awarded for each category win and 2 points for each highly commended. If a person puts multiple entries into a category, only the highest scoring will count. Group entries will not be eligible for overall winner which is a competition for individuals.

Collect / Donate. You have the option to return to collect your entry after 3pm. or to donate it to the Fete to be sold on. You can indicate your preference on the entry ticket. We will not sell any children's entries regardless of what is written on the entry ticket. Any items that were marked for collection that are not collected by 4pm will be left in the produce tent for the elves.
