Science Curriculum Update

It has been a busy half term in the science department!

Year 7 have made an excellent start on their science studies and have particularly enjoyed doing lots of practical investigations to support their learning. They have done chromatography to separate the inks in different pens, filtration and evaporation to produce pure water from salty, sandy water, and even discovered what happens to a spring if you stretch it too much!

Year 8 have been working on the topic of energy transfers, learning about the importance of insulation in our homes and workplaces to prevent heat energy from being lost. In the metals topic, they have learnt about the reactivity of metals and have competed an investigation that explains why gold and silver is used to make jewellery, rather than magnesium.

Year 9 have completed some advanced work, looking at the structure of the atom and how the periodic table is organised. They have also learnt why Mendeleev was a misunderstood genius. Year 9 have also looked at motion and are able to use graphs to tell the story of a journey, as well as use different equations to calculate acceleration.

Year 10 have made a start on their GCSE course with great enthusiasm. They have been learning about how the chemical structure of different substances links to their properties, and about the importance of health and how disease can be spread (and prevented!).

Finally, Year 11 have been studying ecology, including investigating the abiotic factors that influence an ecosystem. They have also learnt about the importance of exchange surfaces in living organisms, and how they are adapted to ensure that important substances are absorbed and transported efficiently. We have had the opportunity to complete some heart dissections too, which the students have really enjoyed!

Our Sheep Update!

Say hello to our wonderful sheep!Y8 students have been creating a clay tile using the relief technique and have been using their knowledge of mark making to add texture in the style of Henry Moore.These beauties will now by drying over the half term break so that we can fire them in our kiln. Once fired, students will learn the technique of wax and ink resist to add further mark making and colour to them. Well done Y8, we hope you have enjoyed creating them.







Maths Update

Wow, what an exciting first term in Maths we have had! It started with a wonderful set of results from our year 11's just gone in the Summer; which has set the standard to raise the bar again for those to follow. Well done the class of 2024, we are very proud of your achievements.

Our current Year 10's and 11's have a lot to live up to and are on it; they have started an additional qualification in Further Maths. This is a level 2 qualification that bridges the path between GCSE maths and A Level, consolidating what they currently do in GCSE maths along with deepening their understanding and moving into A-level topics in preparation for 6th form. It has been wonderful to see so many students showing ambition and opting to take on this additional hour on top of their timetabled week. At present we have 24 Year 11 students and 32 Year 10 students working towards this. (Please see the pictures attached). This demonstrates an outstanding attitude towards their mathematical journey.


Our very successful Maths Circles Clubs have also been up and running again this term for KS3. Mr Smith's teams of budding mathematicians have been solving all sorts of weird and wonderful maths puzzles, extending their problem solving and mathematical reasoning skills with great enthusiasm.


As a department we would like to thank all the parents and extended families for continuing to support the home learning for Mathematics - particularly the use of SPARX. Home Learning completion in maths is up on this time last year and can only result in a positive impact on the students' learning. The better use of the SPARX books for sharing their work with us is proving effective; it is enabling us to better see where gaps in knowledge and misconceptions are being build up so that we can address them in a more timely manner. We have to mention Year 7, welcome to THS Mathematics, who have made a fabulous flying start with their maths - particularly the engagement with Times Tables Rock Stars. Miss Mullarkey has nearly broken the colour printer making all the certificates needed. Well done Year 7 - keep this up.

Even more exciting news - next term we are bringing in a BRIGHT SPARX league, with additional rewards for completion of independent learning - more details will be revealed on CLASS CHARTS and in maths lessons next term. This will be for ALL year groups and definitely something to look forward to.

We are also proposing to start a maths home learning session to support any students finding it difficult to access SPARX at home, which will also be shared via Class Charts next term to enable all students to participate in and benefit from the BRIGHT SPARX League.

All in all, a fantastic half term, with a lot to be proud of and even more to look forward to. Enjoy your half term break - no matter what SPARX says, the next one is not **due until Monday 11th November.**
