Dear all,

I wanted to put out a formal and factual statement, which I hope will alleviate the understandable concerns that I and my team have received, following on from yesterday's invacuation.

Yesterday two students became very verbally aggressive towards each other and had to be separated as a physical altercation looked likely. There are occasions when we have to take hold of a student - for which staff are trained, if and when the need arises. It can happen when a student presents a risk to themselves, or others around them, and / or for the good order of the school. You may have seen a video – it isn't pleasant to watch but that is the reality of removing a student from a situation that presents a much greater risk such as a physical fight.

Our previous lockdown / invacuation drills have gone smoothly, but as I am sure you will appreciate, reality can sometimes be different. The incident happened at end of break, whilst a good number of students were still outside and not in a building. There was also some confusion with the alarm that sounded. However, staff kept your child safe. This was their priority. We acted out of precaution just as we would with the fire alarm. No students were threatened. I would like to thank all staff for their impeccable effort in keeping all your children - our students - safe, and thank all our students for their calm behaviour during and after this invacuation.

Next week brings Bank Holiday May Day, so we are closed next Monday 6th May, back to normal on Tuesday 7th May. Last weekend, some of our Year 8 students went on a fabulous residential trip, details of which are below. We have also been preparing for our Year 10 ambition evening, which is always a super and valued event by all.

We have received some lovely feedback this week from you, such as complimentary comments on year 8 residential behaviour and our 5 star canteen food. It means so much to us as a team to receive these, so thank you.

Our Year 11 students have begun their GCSE exams. This will involve a slight change of routine and some busy times (such as lunch time) for some of our students, as we make sure our Year 11's are supported as much as possible in this final part of their GCSE journey. I am sure you will all join us in wishing them every success.

Our ARCH day 3 is on Wednesday 8th May. Watch this space for some exciting updates as to what the students get up to!


Learning is thirsty work


We would like to remind all students to bring a water bottle to school with them. We have water fountains around school that students can use to fill their bottles; we do not provide cups for students as

Year 8 Winmarleigh Hall residential trip


The Year 8 residential to Winmarleigh Hall took place on the 26th of April until the 28th of April. The students had a great time, bonding and pushing themselves to try new things.
