Governor Vacancies

Due to relocation, we have a vacancy for a parent governor. The application window for this key voluntary role in our school will open on Monday 9th September 2024 and will close on MONDAY 23rd SEPTEMBER 2024 at 5.00pm. An invitation to apply will go out to parents on Monday by ClassCharts.

To apply, you should follow the process outlined in the letter on ClassCharts, which includes a personal statement of approximately 250 words. These statements will be circulated to all our parents as part of the election process. The ballot period will open on Monday 30th September 2024.

We also have a vacancy for a co-opted governor. There is no election process for this role, and it does not have to be a school parent (although it can be). Co-opted governors are appointed by the governing body and are usually selected for their key skills or expertise that will support the effective running of the school. If you are interested in becoming a co-opted governor – or know someone who is, then please contact clerktogovernors@todhigh.co.uk to begin the application.

Being a school governor is a rewarding role although it does carry some responsibility. The governors at Todmorden High School are engaged and well-informed and the Chair of Governors has a wealth of experience both here and in other schools and academies across West Yorkshire. Your role would be that of a critical friend – looking at the school from above, rather than involving yourself in the operational management of the school.

Governors are appointed for a four-year term. The full Governing Body usually meets 4 times a year. Each governor is usually assigned to at least one of three sub-committees and they meet a further 3 times a year each. Meetings usually are held at 5.30 on a Wednesday evening and last for an average of 2 hours. A week before each meeting, papers are circulated allowing you time to read and prepare questions for the school and to make informed decisions.

Depending on the business of the time, there may be other full governing body meetings, or one-off panel meetings throughout the academic year.


Donna Kendall
