Encourage students to read widely and independently. Ensure that students complete and hand in all homework throughout the year. Use revision resources, such as GCSE Bitesize, Mr Bruff. 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students have knowledge organisers for each unit that they need to learn off by heart; please help test them on this. Encourage students to read widely and independently. Use the CGP revision guides for each literature text; use GCSE Bitesize, Mr Bruff etc. Read articles from The British Library about the literature texts and their contexts Encourage students to attend revision sessions, revise regularly using mind-maps, flash cards, knowledge organisers.
